# Accent On Night Games

Ohio college football has a rare Friday afternoon game, a scattered Saturday daylight program and a bulky night session scheduled on the second big week of the season.

Wittenberg, upset conqueror of Akron last week, plays at Marietta this afternoon. The game was scheduled at night, but a wind storm wrecked the lighting system at the Marietta stadium.

Saturday's program has Mt. Union at Denison in the first Ohio Conference game for the big Red. Mount lost in the fourth quarter against Muskingum last week and Denison coach Keith Piper admits his team "will have to be much sharper than against California (Pa.) to win this one."

Resurgent Otterbein, with two fine passing quarterbacks, several fleet runners and a strong line, opens its OC campaign at home with Oberlin.

Kenyon opens its season at Gambier in another league game. Wooster, which surprised Ashland last week, is the Lords' first 1956 foe as Kenyon tries to end a two-season (14-game) victory drouth.

CAPITAL ALSO launches its season, at Ashland Saturday night. The Lutherans are looking for a tough game with the Mid-Ohio kingpins, who have played two games already.

Muskingum catches another rebounding club at New Concord Saturday night. Akron's highly-touted Zips were shellacked before more than 28,000 Rubber Bowl fans last week and could salve the wounds by ending Muskingum's 10-game win streak. Another conference power.

Heidelberg, entertains an Ohio Wesleyan club that is something of a mystery despite a loss to Rutgers. Heidelberg bounced Hope (Mich.) last week but Saturday night will give the first indication of how both the Princes and Bishops stack up for 1956 Ohio Conference warfare.

ELSEWHERE Saturday afternoon, it's Bowling Green at Western Michigan in the Mid-America spotlight game. Toledo at Ohio U, Xavier at Miami, and Central State at Lincoln, Mo.

Under the lights, it's Findlay at Ohio Northern, Tulsa at Cincinnati, Louisville at Kent State, Midwestern at Youngstown, Franklin at Bluffton and Baldwin-Wallace at Eastern Michigan.

Dayton has a Sunday date at Holy Cross.
