Wittenberg, Toledo Protect Win Streaks

The University of Toledo can clinch its second consecutive Mid-American Conference title and Wittenberg attempts to stay on the road toward its seventh Ohio Conference crown in the last 10 years Saturday.

It's homecoming in the Glass Bowl, and an overflow throng it expected to jam the 16,500-seat edifice to see if the UT Rockets can set a new MAC all-games winning streak by making Miami University's visiting Redskins their 19th consecutive victim over the past two seasons.

MEANWHILE IN Springfield, the Wittenberg Tigers hope to continue the college division's longest current winning streak against an Ohio Wesleyan team that has the offensive fire power to give any opponent some anxious moments.

Wittenberg has won its last 17 starts since a 14-7 loss to Eastern Michigan in the next-to-last game of the 1968 season.

Both games begin at 1:30 p.m. A Miami victory would keep the Redskins and Ohio University — providing the Bobcats win at Western Michigan — alive for a possible title share.

UNBEATEN CAPITAL has a non-conference date at Ashland. The Crusaders can tie a school record of seven straight wins over the past two seasons against the Eagles in the 2 p.m. contest.

Coach Bob (Moe) Agler's improving Otterbein Cardinals, who totaled more than 1,000 yards in 49-28 and 21-17 victories over Hiram and Marietta the past two weeks, also have a non-conference matchup Saturday.

The Otters are at Defiance for a 2 p.m. go-around with the Mid-Ohio Conference champion Yellow Jackets. DE bounced back with a 26-0 win over Bluffton last week to clinch its third straight MOC title after Manchester ended its 18-game winning streak, 10-7 the week before.

OTHER OHIO Conference games send Muskingum to Denison, Kenyon to Oberlin, Hiram to Wooster, Marietta to Mt. Union, and Baldwin-Wallace to Heidelberg. The

Muskie-Denison game starts at 1:30 p.m. A Wooster win would keep the Scots "perfect" for next week's big one against Wittenberg.

Ohio University's Mid-Am game at Western Michigan begins at 1:30 p.m. Marshall is at Bowling Green, and Kent state at Louisville outside the MAC this week.

Gary Kosins, the nation's major college leading rusher and scorer, and his University of Dayton mates are at Northern Illinois, Cincinnati at Wichita State, Xavier at Villanova, and Central State hosts Hillsdale, Mich., in games involving Ohio independents.

Saturday's game is Toledo's final MAC test and a win would also assure the Rockets of a return trip to the Dec. 28 Tangerine Bowl in Orlando, Fla., against the Southern Conference representative.

OHIO U. closes out its Mid-Am season Nov. 7 at Bowling Green and Miami hosts Kent State in its conference finale Nov. 14 following a Nov. 7 clash with Dayton in Oxford. A three-way tie would require a vote of the athletic directors to decide the Tangerine representative.

Toledo has a gaudy 32-5-1 record since its current run of success began in 1967 and has won its last nine MAC starts. Miami teams in the 1953-56 era won 14 conference games in a row, so the Rockets still have something to shoot at in that regard.

DOYT PERRY'S Bowling Green teams of 1958-60 established the 18-game all-games winning streak that Toledo tied with its 34-17 win over Kent State last week.

UT Rockets shared the 1967 crown with Ohio U.

Wittenberg's final Ohio Conference game is a Nov. 7 date at Wooster. Capital is at Baldwin-Wallace, Nov. 7, and hosts arch rival Otterbein, Nov. 14. Wooster also finishes up OC warfare Nov. 14 at Oberlin.

The OC title is decided on a percentage basis. All teams do not necessarily play the same number of conference games.
