Dallas Wins First Match

The \$14,000,000 National Bowling League shoved off on its maiden journey Thursday night with Dallas swamping New York 22-2 in the opening match.

A crowd of 2000 turned out as the Dallas Broncos and New York Gladiators had the honor of opening the 135-match campaign that will have teams from ten cities playing five nights a week for six months.

Giant arenas costing an estimated \$14,000,000 will operate in Dallas, New York, Omaha, Detroit, Fresno, Fort Worth, Kansas City, Minneapolis-St. Paul and Los Angeles. San Antonio will be operated by the league as a swing team because it didn't finish its arena in time.

Rugged Running Scots Seek 4th Win at Denison

A gruelling ground game, aided and abetted by an effective two-platoon system, keys the attack of the undefeated Wooster Scots who'll kilty into Granville Saturday afternoon to meet Denison's Big Red in an Ohio Conference encounter, the 46th meeting of the two schools on the gridiron.

Denison's Big Red is not quite as big as had been expected after two straight shiners, inflicted convincingly by Akron and again by Muskingum.

Coach Phil Shipe has a 20-letterman Scot squad and his free substitution style—employing a lot of freshmen—makes the most of his material.

WOOSTER'S leading ground pounder is Jim Webber, a freshman from Manlius, N.Y., who has amassed 233 yards and three TDs in 24 lugs with the leather.

To replace stellar Steve McClellan, the fine Wooster fullback the past four seasons, Shipe is using Guy DiCicco, a sophomore from Springfield, Pa., and Walt Blaich, Cuyahoga Falls freshman. DiCicco does the punting and has spiraled 13 for an average of 35.6 yards.

Bill Washburn, senior quarterback from Akron Coventry, is the Wooster quarterback.

IT'S A grim Denison coach, Keith Piper, that is prepping his club for Saturday's tilt. "After losing such a disappointing affair (Muskingum 13-7) it will be tough to get the boys up for this one. In addition they (Wooster) always play their best against us."
