Born November 22nd, 1885, in Lima, Ohio.

Attended school there and in northeastern Indiana.

Began teaching at age 17.

Attended the Otterbein Academy.

Married Armintha Jackson, November 26th, 1910.

Three children: Bonita, Alberta, and Robert.

Bachelor of Arts Degree from Otterbein College in 1914.

Bachelor of Divinity Degree from Bonebrake Theological Seminary, 1917.

(Now United Theological Seminary.)

Member of Sandusky Conference, 1912-1956.

Ordination in 1917.

Pastorates from student days until 1924.

Included Teegarden, Ind.; Angus, Neb.; McClure, Ohio;

Toledo Somerset, Ohio; Elliott, Ill.; and Bradley, Ill.

Military Chaplaincy Service, 1918-19.

Graduate work at the University of Chicago.

M.A. in 1922.

Residence work completed for PH.D.

Professor of Bible at Otterbein College, 1923-1956.

(Appointed in 1923; began teaching in 1924.)

Taught courses in Bible, Religious Education, and Philosophy.

Myers Professor of Bible from 1936.

Chairman of the Department of Bible and Philosophy.

Chairman of the Division of Social Studies.

Summer Session at Biblical Seminary of New York in 1930.

Faculty Advisor of Council of Christian Associations.

Included Library, Curriculum, Faculty-student Housing, Policy, Honorary Degrees, Spiritual Life, Conference Relationships, Graduate Opportunities, Member of Dean's Council (as Class Counselor).
