Doyt Perry's defending Mid-American Conference champion Bowling Green, only other unbeaten Buckeye College team (3-0), faces its first MAC foe, Western Michigan, which has lost both of its conference tests to date. In other MAC conflicts, Marshall and Toledo, each 1-0, come to grips in Toledo and Miami and Kent State, each winners of their only conference games, play at Kent.

**XAVIER'S** Musketeers winners three of their four times out, tangles with University of Cincinnati in renewal of the old Queen City rivalry. Cincy, a Missouri Valley Conference member, is 1-1 for the season. Dayton, mauled by Holy Cross last week, plays at Boston College.

Muskingum will meet Wittenberg at Springfield in the Fighting Lutherans' homecoming game. The Muskies cancelled practices early in the week when 16 of the 33-man squad was bedded with the flu. Coach Ed Sherman said, however, he'd have every able-bodied man in uniform but perhaps for only limited duty.

**KENYON**, idle since dropping its opener to Wooster

25-7 two weeks ago, faces a rough afternoon against the seasoned Capital outfit. The Lords' sub-fullback Ray Burghardt is out for the season with a head injury and halfback Brian Donohue and end Phil Banning have been dropped from the squad.

Coach Bill Stiles cast nothing but gloom on the Lords' chances against Cap when he said: "Capital has us both in experience and depth with backs like Eddie Garver and Chuck Kessler, and probably the roughest line we'll meet all season. I'm afraid Cap has too much offensive power for us to handle."

**DESPITE THE 34-19** pasting Otterbein hung on Oberlin, Agler was not over optimistic about the Cards' chances against Mount Union.

"We made too many little mistakes, the kind the average wouldn't notice, but in the films they were easy to spot," Agler said. Once again the Cards are reported in top physical condition.

### CRUISING THE CAMPS—

Ohio University's Jim Woods has tough luck as far as making long plane trips with the Bobcat gridders. A year ago Woods missed the trip to Florida State because of tonsillitis. Now, after gaining

# Round Table Heads Field In Gold Cup

CHICAGO — (AP) — Travis Kerr's Round Table, the leading candidate for 3-year-old honors, will head a probable field of eight starters in Saturday's \$100,000 added Hawthorne Gold Cup.

Challenging Round Table in the mile and one-quarter race will be E. Gay Drake's Swoon's Son, a ranking nominee for handicap horse of the year, and Alfred G. Vanderbilt's Find.

Other probable starters include Hasty House Farm's Mahan, L. G. Burns' Eddie Schmidt, J. C. Dobkin's Top Award, W. H. Bishop's Bernburgoo and S. G. Babbitz' Speed Rouser.

If all eight start, the race will gross \$128,550 with the winner netting \$76,700.
