Night Games at Otterbein

NIGHT baseball has become an institution in the city and practically every local high school now plays its football games under the arcs.

For the first time this Saturday, however, Columbus area sports fans will have a chance to see college football played at night when Otterbein College opens its home season against Denison University.

Otterbein, located in the shadow of Ohio State University whose grid team attracts upwards of 80,000 fans to its home games, and beset with the competition from telecasts of other leading football games, has had a serious attendance problem in recent years.

Determined to keep the sport alive at Otterbein where it has been played for nearly 70 years, a group of interested alumni, town-folks, and Westerville merchants approached college officials with the proposal of night football.

The officials were receptive to the idea but like the administrators of most small colleges, who find money hard to come by, were reluctant to spend college funds for the purpose of installing lighting equipment.

So the group that initiated the idea, which calls itself the O Club, has underwritten the cost of the lights, confident that increased attendance will soon pay for the investment.

As a result, football enthusiasm on the campus and in Westerville is at an all-time high. One fan expressed the feeling of many when he exclaimed:

"I'll be able to watch the high

school play Friday night, go to the Ohio State game Saturday afternoon, watch Otterbein play Saturday night, and watch the Cleveland Browns on TV Sunday afternoon."
