Mighty Muskie Making More Points

Muskies' Cooper Tops OC Scoring

Bill (Cannonball) Cooper, Muskingum's 204-pound sophomore fullback, flashed into the Ohio Conference individual scoring lead this week as a result of his 32-point spree last Saturday against Findlay.

The New Philadelphia product has accounted for seven touchdowns and a total of 52 points in four games. Considerably behind him, in second place, is Ohio Wesleyan quarterback Doug

Schmidt, who has scored 32 points.

SCHMIDT HAS regained the total offense lead in the conference, and the smooth Bishops' signal-caller now has personally accounted for 501 yards. Schmidt has accumulated 389 of these passing, on

the strength of 27 completions in 60 tries, and trails Oberlin's conference-leading Bill Guerrero in that department. Guerrero has completed 31 of 65, for 427 yards and five touchdowns.

Oberlin halfback Harvey Singer bounced into a tie for the lead in pass receiving, with 11 catches for 139 yards. Two of his teammates are in the top four.

WESLEYAN END Dick DeHaven also has caught 11 aeriels, for 136 yards, and trailing him are Oberlin fullback Joe Horn (10 for 93) and Oberlin end Dave Steller (8 for 151). Wittenberg halfback Ron Murphy has the most yardage, however, with 171 on 7 catches.

There were few other major changes in the rankings.

Otterbein slipped from first to sixth in team pass defense after its tangle with Oberlin and Guerrero, but Muskingum kept its lead in team offense (312.7 yards per game), rushing offense (269.7) and Oberlin its pass offense lead (167.7).
