Cap-Otterbein Tops Traditional Finales

No matter what has gone before, the season boils down to a single game Saturday at Delaware and at Bernlohr Stadium.

Records, good or bad, will be forgotten when once-mighty Denison winds up a disastrous 1958 season Saturday at 2 p.m. on Ohio Wesleyan's Selby Field.

The mistakes of a rebuilding year for both will be dismissed when Otterbein and Capital meet in their annual fire and brimstone bath on the Capital campus.

FOR THESE ARE the windup games of 1958, the central Ohio feature attractions of a 19-game Ohio college schedule that will be all over Saturday except for four games next week.

"Regardless of the traditional rivalry, it would stack up as a close game anyway," says Otterbein Coach Bob Agler.

Otterbein will pit power up the middle, good outside running and top passing against a good Capital line and pass defense. Capital's success may depend upon how far and fast freshman halfback Al White can run with an injured leg.

OHIO FANS will be watching to see how Xavier writes the finish to its comeback story against Kentucky's big-

time Wildcats at Lexington. Xavier won three straight after a dismal 2-4 start. Defeats by Mississippi, Auburn and LSU help account for Kentucky's 3-5 record.

Cincinnati travels to Milwaukee to meet Marquette, another team that plays a rugged schedule. The in-and-out Bearcats have tagged the Warriors with four straight losses. Cincinnati closes its season with the traditional Thanksgiving Day game against Miami.

Miami, meanwhile, will be hosting Dayton and looking for its 14th win in 23 games in the series. A tough Dayton line should give the Redskins a good test.

MUSKINGUM will be out to clinch second place in the Ohio Conference with a victory at Mt. Union. Fullback Bill (Cannonball) Cooper of the Muskies will be trying to wrap up the OC scoring and rushing lead. He has 84 points and 735 yards.

Marietta freshman whiz Jim Hissam trails Cooper by only 24 yards in the rushing statistics and will get his last chance to catch Cooper against Bethany, W. Va. Marietta, now 4-4, will shoot for its first winning season since 1954. The last time
