# Kidwell Leads Otters Over Oberlin, 28-7

The powerful running of halfback Gene Kidwell, the sharp direction of quarterback Dave Kull and an ample defense combined to carry Otterbein to a 28-7 victory over previously undefeated Oberlin in the Cardinal stadium Saturday night.

The win was the fourth straight for the Otters who have a 3-0 mark in the Ohio Conference. It was Oberlin's first setback in three starts and the Yeomen are now 1-1 in conference play.

Oberlin outgained the Otters in total offense 301 to 293 but the Cardinals had the starch when it was needed and blunted three Oberlin drives when the situation grew a bit dangerous.

KIDWELL lugged the ball 23 times and picked up 188 yards and scored one touchdown. Kull pitched a pair of touchdown passes and called an attack that produced the victory.

Al Spiegelberg, Oberlin's

highly regarded fullback, lived up to advance notices. He ran 26 times but could total only 82 yards as the Otter defenses kept him bottled most of the evening. He did score the only Oberlin TD in the second period.

Otterbein showed its muscle without delay. They took the opening kickoff and in 15 plays scored. Bill Messmer tallied from the three. He and Kidwell chewed up most of the yardage in the drive. Gary Fields booted the first of his four conversions.

OBERLIN came up with the equalizer with little more than 5 minutes left in the half. The 71-yard route was marked by a 25-yard toss from Spiegelberg to John McCaslin. Spiegelberg did the honors on a one-yard plunge. He also kicked the point.

After the kickoff Otterbein needed only 8 plays to cover 61 yards. Messmer scored again this time on a 13-yard pitch from Kull.

THE THIRD period Otterbein score was set up with Glenn Aidt recovered an Oberlin fumble on the visitors' 29-yard line. Kidwell scored four plays later from the four.

With only 1:25 left in the game Otterbein hit the scoreboard again. This time it was Kull pitching a 37-yarder to Gary Reynolds.
