Capital opened with a 20-7 loss at the hands of Ashland and defeated Ohio Northern by the same score last week. Denison shut out Centre, 34-0, in its first 1971 start, but dropped a tight 8-7 decision at Ithaca last week.

HARRIS RIPPED through the Ithaca defense for 200 yards, but a long TD interception return and two-point conversion gave the host team the nod. It was one of five interceptions along with two fumbles and a pair of costly penalties that added to the Denison demise, according to Coach Keith Piper.

"If we're going to win, we'll have to eliminate a lot of mistakes and play a sounder football game," he said, looking ahead to this week's test against Cap.

Both teams are in reasonably sound shape physically for what figures to be another close game.

MUSKINGUM will again be without the services of stand-out runner Dave Hayes (torn rib cartilage) for its big test against Baldwin-Wallace. His replacement, sophomore full-

back Bob Thorne of Gehanna, garnered 141 yards in last week's 20-7 loss to Marietta.

One of Otterbein's three victories a year ago was by forfeit over Wittenberg but the Otters well remember the 75-7 pasting the Tigers dealt them on the playing field. A season-long ineligible player caused Wittenberg to forfeit its 9-0 season in 1970.

Otterbein opened with a 15-14 win at Kenyon and dropped a 42-7 decision to independent Ashland last week. Wittenberg rebounded with a 13-7 win over California (Pa.) State after a 33-7 loss at Western Kentucky.

Ohio Wesleyan's game at Clarion matches a couple of early unbeaens. The Bishops edged Heidelberg, 14-8, and followed up with a 25-3 win over DePauw. Clarion has beaten Mansfield (Pa.) State, 34-0, and Southern Connecticut, 16-0.

There are four games on the Hoosier-Buckeye Conference schedule. Anderson is at Hanover and Indiana Central at Manchester in the afternoon and Bluffton at Wilmington and Defiance at Findlay at night.
