

Tigers Lead OC All-Stars

Wittenberg University placed eight men and Capital University four on the 1970 All-Ohio Conference football team. The two teams shared the mythical title.

Coach Gene Slaughter of Capital, who guided the Crusaders to a share of their first-ever OC football championship, was named coach of the year. Both the team and coach's ward are determined in balloting among the football coaches of the 14-member schools.

WITTENBERG placed five men on the offensive and two on the defensive platoons and Capital had a pair of honorees on both sides of the line of scrimmage.

The Tiger offensive choices included Rick Mako, Joe Paoloni, Terry McNutt, Rocky Alt and Darryl Herring. Denny Yontz, Bill Bibbee and Scott McDowell represented WU on the first-team defensive team.

HALFBACK Mike Goodman and tackle Jim Jones were the Capital offensive selections. Linebacker Jim Brandon and deep back Bill Kidd were chosen from the Crusader defensive unit.

Slaughter's team lost only to independent Ashland Colleges in regular season play. The Crusaders' 7-1 record included a 6-0 finish in the OC. Co-champion Wittenberg had a 5-0 conference mark included in its 9-0 overall record.
