# Otters' 22-10 Win Tumbles Pioneers

Otterbein, with an effective mixture of running and passing, upset Marietta 22-10 in the Cardinals' homecoming game Saturday and knocked the visiting Pioneers out of a share of the Ohio Conference football lead.

Marietta previously had whipped three conference foes in winning four of five games overall. Baldwin Wallace's triumph over Wittenberg left the Yellow Jackets and Ohio Wesleyan, who played a non-league foe Saturday, atop the OC standings with 3-0 records.

**DOUG THOMSON**, 205-pound Canadian junior halfback, and quarterbacks Jerry Elliott, a senior from Westerville, and junior Greg Miller fashioned the Otterbein success.

Thomson picked up 123 yards in 26 carries. Elliott completed four of nine passes, including two for touchdowns, and Miller targeted three of six. Otterbein's passink yardage was 125. The Cards ripped the Marietta defenses for 208 yards on the ground.

The win squared Otterbein's conference (2-2) and season records (3-3).

**MARIETTA** scored first in the opening period when quarterback Dave Morris hit flanker Dave Scheithauer for a 23-yard touchdown strike. Chuck Bigley kicked the point.

Otterbein took the lead in the second period on a seven-play, 55-yard drive capped by Miller's 17-yard touchdown toss to Steve Traylor. Jim Bontadelli, a sophomore from Columbus Walnut

Ridge, ran for the two-point conversion.

The Pioneers regained the lead when, stalled on the Otters' nine-yard line at the end of a sustained drive, Bigley kicked a 23-yard field goal to make the tally 10-8 midway in the third period.

The Otters wrapped it up

with a pair of final period touchdowns.

**AFTER** A punt exchange Otterbein gained two yards on the first play and Elliott found Traylor open on the right side and the touchdown maneuver was good for 53 yards. Leif Pettersen, another Canadian, kicked the point.

Otterbein drove deep into Marietta territory late in the period and moved to the two-yard line. Les Donehue took the handoff and tossed back to Elliott who threw to Dave Mack for the tally. Pettersen completed the scoring with a placement.

Marietta had won four in a row after dropping a season opening 26-0 decision to Westminster, which has the longest winning streak among the nation's college division teams.
