Otterbein Gets Second Triumph

Otterbein broke a 6-6 second quarter tie and went on to finish ahead of Oberlin, 19-12, Saturday at Westerville for its second straight victory.

After the visitors pulled within one point in the third quarter, the Otters put the game on ice with a fourth period touchdown via the airways with Mel Staats passing to John Magaw good for 10 yards and a score with 6:36 remaining.

The first Oberlin score was accounted for by Dave Hoecker, who went off left tackle for three yards in the second period. The try for extra point was blocked.

Otterbein broke the tie when Eric Dowell went 22 yards to climax a drive of 73 yard march. John McCreary

kicked the extra point.

Otterbein trailed the losers in first downs, 13-12. On the ground, Otterbin picked up 183 yards to 259 for the visitors. In the air, the Otters gained 60 yards in eight of 14 completions as to 33 for Oberlin in three of six successes.

Bill Heltz and Larry Lintner sparked the last Otterbein drive by picking up gains of 15 and 22, respectively.
