Otterbein, B-W Carry 7-0 Marks

The 1961 Ohio college football season may be heading down the home stretch, but the 27-game card last Saturday was the biggest of the season and had one of the biggest arrays of spectacular performances seen yet.

Otterbein and Baldwin-Wallace lead in the statewide standing with 7-0. Otterbein did it on a 15-13 triumph over stubborn Ashland. B-W had an easier time rolling to a 33-7 win over Heidelberg. The victory was the Yellow Jackets' 10th in a row over two years—the longest win streak in the school's history.

A THREE-WAY battle for the mid-American conference crown is going on between defending titlist Ohio University, Bowling Green and

surprise challenger Western Michigan. Ohio U, a 14-7 winner over Marshall, meets Bowling Green Saturday in Athens.

The Falcons ball-control and rock-rib defensive tactics were too much for West Texas State and "Pistol Pete" Pedro, the nation's third leading ground gainer. B-G posted a 28-6 victory and held the shifty halfback to a mere 28 yards in 10 carries.

OBERLIN'S Alan Speigelberg held onto his lead in the state scoring race, tallying all the Yeomen's seven points as they tied unbeaten Susquehanna. The versatile junior has scored 74 points on nine touchdowns, four field goals and eight extra point kicks.

Faller, Not Walter

Robert Faller scored St. Charles' TD on that 99-yarder against Watterson Saturday night and not Bob Walter as reported. Watterson's John Schultheis led the way in a 16-6 victory.
