And McLay, a veteran of 13 years in the IHL was credited with his 601st career assist on Bob Tombari's second period score.

Columbus scored both of its goals in the second period. Angus Beck drove the puck past Johnny Anderson on a backhand shot from the right side with an assist from Jim Bartlett.

WAYNE (CHIEF) KING produced the only other Columbus score on the team's second power play goal of the season at 17:25 of the second period. Doug Moyes collected his 16th point on the assist.

Byrom dashed 51 yards for the Crusaders' second tally with 22 second left in the same session. Hess' nine-yard, run capped a nine-play, 57-yard advance that put Cap up 21-10 early in the second quarter.
