# Cap Hosts Muskies; Scots, Zips Battle

While Wooster and Akron are cutting each other up Saturday afternoon in an Ohio Conference survival of the fittest, Capital and Denison will just be trying to survive, and Ohio Wesleyan might have its hands full.

Only Otterbein (1-2 in conference play) has what might be considered an easy assignment, playing host to winless Hiram (0-3) in the Otters' Homecoming at 2 p.m., only day game of the season in Westerville.

THERE'S practically a full slate of conference games in every league, with 21 contests being scheduled. All but four — Kenyon at Marietta, Bluffton at Findlay, Louisville at Dayton and Cincinnati at College of Pacific—are daylight affairs.

Wooster and Wittenberg lead the Ohio Conference with 2-0 records and Akron

is third at 3-1. The Scots and Zippers are both defense-minded clubs, so the league's big one may be a low scoring affair. It looks like a tossup.

**CAPITAL COACH** Jack Landrum has done a good rebuilding job so far with the Lutherans, now 2-1, but Ed Sherman's Muskingum Club may take it all apart, brick by brick, in the 2 p.m. contest at Capital.

The Muskies' only loss in four games was by a single point—8-7 to Akron.


Denison also has a busy afternoon in store, visiting

its only 1957 conqueror, Heidelberg, at Tiffin. The Big Red and the Princes (both 1-2) are practically out of the OC title picture, so it resolves into a grudge battle.

**OBERLIN TAKES** the top passing attack in the conference to Delaware, but Yoe-man quarterback Bill Guerrero and his receivers have no complementary ground game to keep the defense honest. Wesleyan does.

Wittenberg has an easy assignment at Springfield, facing Mt. Union (1-3, so it should be four straight conference conquests for Coach Bill Edwards.

Miami (2-0) and Ohio U. (1-1) collide in the co-feature Mid-American Conference contest at Athens, and Kent State (1-1), will try to rebound

from last week's loss to the Redskins by entertaining Marshall (1-1). Bowling Green (1-0) at Toledo (0-2) completes the MAC slate.

**BOWLING GREEN** (4-0 overall), OSU and Central State (3-0) are the state's lone unbeaten. Central State hosts Kentucky State at Wilberforce.

The feature game Saturday night is the Bluffton-Findlay affair, with both unbeaten in Mid-Ohio League play. Bluffton is 3-0, Findlay 2-0.
