encounter this season. And both are decided underdogs.

PIPER'S Denison University club, coming off a discouraging 21-14 loss at Capital last week, has a 1:30 p.m. Ohio Conference test in Granville against a Wittenberg team that has won its last 14 games.

Nehlen's Bowling Green team, which has managed only a 14-14 tie with Dayton in three outings, is at Toledo for an 8 p.m. Mid-American Conference skirmish. The Rockets have won 15 straight.

Both Wittenberg and Toledo are the defending champions of their respective conferences. Wittenberg's streak is the college division's second longest and Toledo has the third best win skein going among the nation's major colleges.

WINLESS Ohio Wesleyan hosts Wooster in a 1:30 p.m. Selby Stadium homecoming attraction, while Mt. Union goes against an Otterbein team that is still looking for its first win in an 8 p.m. game under the Memorial Stadium lights in Westerville.

Capital checks out Coach Jack Murphy's surprising Heidelberg Student Princes in an 8 p.m. night game at Tiffin, and Marietta is at Hiram in other Ohio Conference games.

Saturday's other Mid-Am contest sends Western Michigan to Kent State. The Golden Flashes last victory over

Western was by a 10-3 margin in 1960.

MUSKINGUM hosts independent Ashland in a 2 p.m. homecoming game in New Concord, and Kenyon hopes to return to winning ways at Lake Forest in a couple of non-conference games involving OC teams.

Ohio University also celebrates homecoming at 1:30 p.m. Saturday when Dayton plays in Peden Stadium. Unbeaten Miami attempts to make Marshall its fourth straight victim during a weekend trip to Huntington, W. Va.

Defiance, unbeaten and untied in its last 17 games, visits Wilmington for an 8 p.m. Mid-Ohio Conference get-together. The Yellow Jacket streak is the longest among the nation's college division teams.

BLUFFTON, with a streak diametrically opposed to that of Defiance, is at Findlay in the MOC game. It's also an 8 p.m. affair. The Beavers of Bluffton have lost 14 in a row.

Piper has beaten Wittenberg only once in seven previous tries since he became Denison's head coach in 1954.

The victory was by a 13-8 margin in 1955.

Saturday's Denison homecoming game is a timely one for Wittenberg Coach Dave Maurer, a former Big Red quarterback who gained All-Ohio Conference honors prior to his 1954 graduation.

Denison opened the 1970 season with victories over Centre, 37-21, and Ithaca, 35-27, prior to last week's reversal at Cap. Wittenberg, 10-0 a year ago, has handled California (Pa.) State, Central State and Otterbein in ridiculously easy fashion to date this fall.

MAURER HOPES his quarterback, Rocky Alt, will be able to play despite a cracked rib. Piper has the OC's top ball carrier in tailback Ed Exler.

Bowling Green opened with a 33-14 loss at Utah State and dropped a 23-3 decision at Western Michigan last week in addition to its tie with Dayton. It's the first time a Falcon football team has failed to win at least one of its first three games since 1935.

Toledo holds easy wins over East Carolina, Buffalo, Marshall and Ohio University this
