

Garver Leads Cap to 33-7 Final Victory

Otterbein Is Crumbled In Bitterly-Waged Game

Halfback Eddie Garver's four touchdowns sparked Capital to a 33-7 win over arch-rival Otterbein in a bitterly-waged football finale for both teams at Westerville Saturday.

Held to a slender 6-0 lead at halftime, Capital staged a strong second half spurt that spiked Otterbein hopes for an upset. The Lutherans finished with a 5-3 season record, Otterbein with 2-5-1.

Only the officials outgained Garver who picked up 193 yards in 16 carries. A total of 203 yards in penalties were stepped off against Otterbein, 135 against Cap.

JIM SMOOT, starting left half for the Lutherans, reportedly suffered a compound fracture of the upper left arm. The Canal Winchester grad who now lives in Marion, was injured near the end of the first quarter.

Garver, sophomore from Navarre, sped 32 yards for the first Cap touchdown and followed with scoring sprints of 1, 53 and 12 yards. The last Lutheran score, late in the game, was on a 12-yard pass from Chuck Kessler to Jim Burke.

Larry Lintner scored the Cardinal TD on a one-yard plunge. Otterbein's only other serious threat was halted at the Capital one in the first half.

GARVER'S FOUR touch-

downs gave him 14 for the season, believed to be a new Capital scoring record.

While the first half was fairly even, Capital eventually built up a 16 to 8 edge in first downs and outgained the Otters on the ground 265 to 178. In passing it was 54 yards for Cap, usually a strong aerial team, and 104 for the Cards.
