Avid Readers

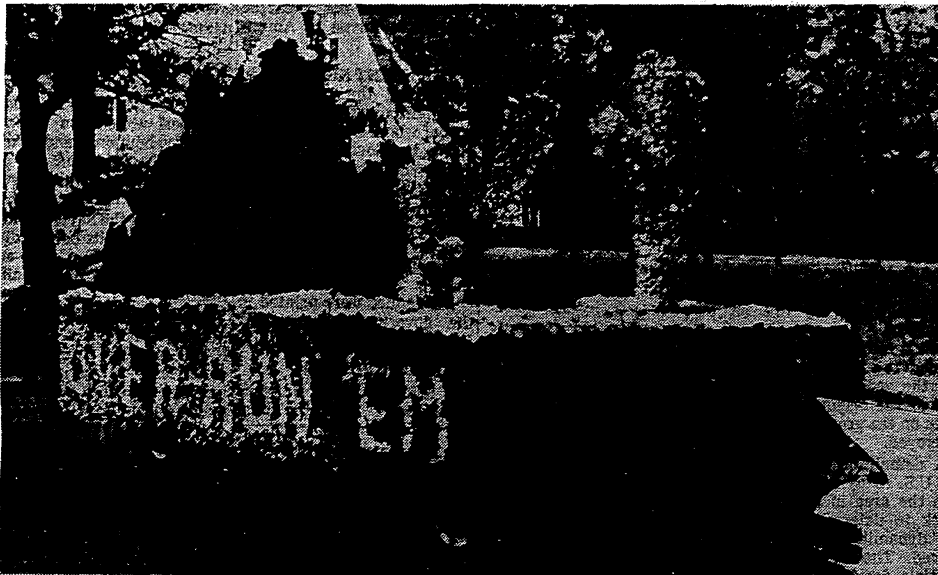
