# Otters Blank Hiram, 50-0

## Score Seven Touchdowns In Last Three Periods

Otterbein opened up after a scoreless first period and pushed over seven touchdowns in the remaining three periods to drub Hiram before 3500 homecoming fans in Westerville Saturday afternoon, 50-0.

The Otters now carry a record of two wins, two losses and a tie.

Gary Allen, the sophomore fullback from Columbus North, scored two of the seven touchdowns, both on short plunges through the center of the line.

Longest scoring play was a 45-yard pass-run play from Larry Cline to Ron Jones in the second quarter.

Hiram's best scoring chance came in the first period when it recovered an Otterbein fumble on the latter's four. The visitors were halted and the home team took over on the 11 yard stripe four plays later. They never threatened after that.

Otterbein gained 172 yards via rushing to minus 19 for Hiram. The Otters picked up 175 yards on eight of 17 completions. Hiram also completed eight of 17 for 100 yards.

The winners racked up 19 first downs to five for Hiram.

The win gave the league leaders a 3-0 conference record and a 3-1 season mark.

The Bobcats opened the scoring when sophomore fullback Bob Brooks plunged across from the 2-yard line in the first quarter. Ohio fell behind 8-7 in the second stanza, then went ahead 10-8 on a field goal in the third period.

WITH 12 MINUTES remaining in the game, however, Redskin halfback Dave Gilbert capped a 10-play, 60-yard drive by darting across from the two.

Roth Miami and Ohio U. relied on ground attacks. The Bobcats attempted two passes and the Redskins four.
