

# Otterbein In Fifth Victory

Undefeated Otterbein rolled up its fifth straight victory Saturday with a convincing 46-13 triumph over Marietta in an Ohio Conference game played at Westerville.

It was win No. 4 in the conference for the Otters as compared to a overall of 2-4 and 1-4 in the loop for the Pioneers.

It took Otterbein almost one full quarter to get into the scoring column. Larry Cline went over on a one yard sneak to climax a 68 yard drive. Jack Spicer, ex-Linden griddier, set-up the score with a 20 yard run just prior to the initial score.

The Cardinals rang up points in the next three quarters, too, the third being the largest with a 20 point total.

Ironically all seven Otterbein touchdowns were scored by different players. Larry Cline, who scored the first Otter TD, also passed for two others.

Longest scoring play was in the third quarter when Cline passed to Ron Jones for a 35 yard gain.

Marietta scored one of its touchdowns on a 32 yard pass play from Dave Coulter to Jack Williams.

**IN THE** statistical department, Otterbein recorded 22 first downs to 16 for Marietta. The winners gained 350 yards by rushing and 90 via the airways. Marietta rolled up 207 yards on the ground and 131 by passes. Quarterback Coulter of Marietta completed 14 of 32 passes.

**JACK SPICER** ground out

90 yards in 10 carries to pace the winners. Cline completed three of six passes for 90 yards.

The Otterbein line was sparked by John McCreary, Dick Berlo and Lou Regis.
