History of the Underground Railroad



Many of us know that slaves escaped the harshness and brutality of slavery in the South by running away to seek freedom and a better way of life. Some slaves looked to Northern states including Ohio for their freedom, but they could not have made it and survived without the help of Abolitionists and the Underground Railroad. To learn more about Ohio's role in the Underground Railroad, join the Friends of the library as we welcome Cathy D. Nelson, Ohio Humanities Council and Founder/President Emeritus of the Friends of Freedom Society. Ms. Nelson, an expert on the Underground Railroad, has been speaking about and raising awareness to the bravery of fugitive slaves on the Underground Railroad for more than twenty years.

During her discussion, Ms. Nelson will talk about the significant role Ohio played with its many trails and homes (more than 1,000 documented Underground Railroad sites) and the vital role some of the trails and homes had in assisting escaped slaves.

Come discover Ohio's Underground Railroad right in your backyard on **Sunday, February 10, from 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.** at the Battelle Hall Riley Auditorium. The cost for this event is \$10.00 for adults and Free for students. This event is sponsored by Otterbein's Friends of the Library and refreshments are being served. The Hanby House will be open for tours immediately following the program (3:00-4:00 p.m.) and is free for program participants.
